<p>A.4 Describe the injury risk-panorama in the community.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ The current state of deaths caused by injuries The injury death rate of the entire nation has continuously increased since 2002. The injury death rate in 2002 was 2.5 times higher than the national injury death rate. However, it has narrowed the gap for the past 10 years. The national injury rate was 64.15 in 2011 and the injury rate of Samcheok was 117.55, showing a huge decrease. ▪ The trend in the death rate caused by injury by cause of injuries The major three causes of injury death were suicide, Road Traffic Injury, and falling. The death rate caused by suicide was 42.87 per 100,000 people in 2011 and suicide took up about 36.47 out of the entire injury death. The death rate of Road Traffic Injury was 22.13 per 100,000 people and the death rate of falling was 6.91 per 100,000 people. ▪ The trend in the death rate caused by injury by gender For the last 10 years, the injury death rate of men was higher than that of women in Samcheok city. In particular, the injury death rate of men was 163.57, about two times higher than 70.16 of women. ▪ The trend in the death rate caused by injury by age Death only occurred to children below 6 s old and adults over 19 s old in Samcheok in 2011. Section B Structure of the community

B.1 Describe the demographic structure of the community

The population of Samcheok is 72,463 from 34,066 households in December 2012. In terms of sex ratio, the population of men is 36,847 and that of women is 35,616.

In Samcheok, the youth takes up 35% of the population; the middle-aged, 30%; and the senior, 18%. The senior population over 65 years old in Samcheok has increased continuously since 2006. In 2012, the senior population takes up 18.57%, implying an aging society.

At the end of 2012, the number of men handicapped people was two times higher than that of women handicapped people. Physical disorder takes up the most, 57.6%, followed by hearing impairment, visual impairment, and intellectual disability.

In terms of job classification, farm population takes up 25% and self-employment, 23%. The number of agricultural households and fishery households is in decline on the gradual basis.

Samcheok collects and analyzes injury data through WISS to understand the distribution tendency, problems, etc. The results of analysis are applied for injury prevention and safety promotion programs.

The statistical data from the related institutions such as Gangwon Police Agency, Samcheok Police Station, Samcheok Fire Station and Samcheok Office of Education Support are promptly and correctly delivered so that data management is convenient. Furthermore, reliable data collection is possible thanks to quick update of recent data. WISS program is linked from the website of Samcheok city hall for everyone to use.

Currently, the objective data of various statistics are well established. The city plans to additionally establish a system connected to WISS to manage specific injury data about the high-risk groups such as senior and infant. The number of deaths by Road Traffic Injuries in Samcheok is higher than the national average and that of Gangwon-do. However, it shows a continuously decreasing tendency after 2009. The city aims at lowering the number below that of Gangwon-do.

The number of suicide deaths started to decrease in 2009 and increased in 2011 but it is lower than that of Gangwon-do.

▪ Falling Prevention

The number of deaths by falling showed a decreasing tendency in 2009, lower than that of Gangwon-do. Especially, it was lower than the national average in 2010.
