## **Section 2. Describe the structure of the community**

2.1 Describe the demographic structure and different risks in the community

Based on the latest census on 2010 the total population of the district 22 of Tehran municipality was about 233000 inhabitants. Approximately 8 % are below 10 years of age, 16% are between 10-20 years of age, 27% are 20- 30 years old, 32% are 30-50 years old and 17% are more than 50 years of age. Approximately 25% are house wives, 22% are students, 20% are in private business and 11% are employed by the government and 6.4% are retired. The unemployment rate is 5 around 8%. Male to Female ratio is 57/43 percent, the mean family size is 4.2 individual. Population is young with mean age of 32 years old and the literacy rate is more than 99%. The life expectancy is 68 years for males and 70years for females.

2.2 Describe the SC/IP at present and the plans for the future.

The safe community at District 22 after some pause it started functioning again. A house hold survey on 10% of population was performed towards the following aims:

- 1- To evaluate the activities related to safe community and those which have been performed by the safe community committee during the last 5 years
- 2- To calculate the cost of injuries to the society
- 3- To estimate the cost effectiveness of interventions that have been implemented

Plan for the future:

To set priority on safety at recreational activity.

Since the largest artificial lake in Iran was developed at district22 it has been set the recreational safety is the first priority for the safe community future. The recreational safety includes:

- 1- Safety for car occupants
- 2- Safety for bicyclists
- 3- Safety for motorcyclists
- 4- Safety for pedestrian
- 5- Safety for swimmers
- 6- Safety for kids

2.3 Which are the political decisions regarding sustained injury prevention and which has been taken by the local or regional council?

The safe community program was approved by the city council on 2006 and re-enforced by the new member of the Tehran city council on 2013

2.4 Describe the strategic program concerning the safety promotion and injury prevention work, which has been formulated!

The strategy is to empower community and members of the committee by educating the District22 multidisciplinary authorities including some key organizations such as police department for traffic and

some active NGOs. Safe Community philosophy and the extension of the program in safe communities and also how to approach towards a safe community was delivered to The new appointed mayor of the district22 of Tehran municipality encouraged to promote safety with the safe community model at his jurisdiction based on partnership approach on 2014.

Stepwise strategy is as follow:

- 1- Conduct a multisectoral work shop for training and advocacy package
- 2- To conduct one day work shop to advocate, maximum 15 organization representatives
- 3- Employing of manpower for the secretary office(4 experts)
- 4- Preparing a complete Demographic map from the district by use of GIS method
- 5- Developing protocols for data gathering and time table
- 6- Building subcommittees based on priorities
- 7- Re analysis for present situation and re prioritization and developing action plan
- 8- Developing relevant indicators
- 9- Developing Action planning
- 10- Developing an Injury Surveillance system
- 11- Providing support for secretariat office of safe community committee in terms of physical equipment

The Tehran policy making committee for Safe community started on 2006 at the municipality and re appointed on 2013.

**The mandate of the Safe Community Council is to:**

- Select relevant bodies
- Identify areas of priority in each district
- Compile long-term and sustainable plans and programs for each district
- Evaluate efforts made by each district
- Participate in national/international networks

Following this issue the safe community committee for the District22 was formed at the district22 level leading by the Mayor and the secretary is the head of HSE department. This committee has been continuously consolidated and added more members who are representatives for mass entities and local people based on priority.

## **Section 4. Describe the work in regard to indicator 2**

4.1 Describe the sustainable work in regard to SC/IP in following areas and how the different sectors and how the NGOs of interests are involved in the work.

### 1. Safe traffic

-Prevention of traffic related accidents for all age group, both sexes and all road user situations with highly consideration of pedestrians is well developed among the stake holders at the district.

- More traffic law enforcement by police including vehicle inspection.

- A pilot project for the self reporting of any potential hazardous location at traffic places by citizens.

- Putting many warning sentences on billboards and banners all over the districts with safe community emblem.

- Re determination of high risk areas by police department and reporting to the safe community committee.

- Involvement of NGOs for raising awareness among the population and attracting advocacy among stake holders.

-Activities to promote safe cycling is more highlighted by lunching safe cycling campaign including 1000 cyclists in uniform dress and helmet messaging for safety under the safe community emblem.

## 2. Safe homes and leisure times

- Drug abuse prevention program is the most highlighted activities among the youngsters in this respect special camps have been made by NGO named “Tavallodi digar”(means “another birth”) to treat and give them support.

## 4. Safe Children

For the safety of this group it is important to focus on Parents, Schools staff and the child himself. As the statistic suggest the main hazards for this group is Burn, Fall and Trauma which is usually happens at Homes, Public areas and traffic related areas. The safe community steering committee handled this task to the 3 sub committee groups to design intervention and give suggestion for the safety of this group.

### **Groups Activities are:**

1. More enforcement of using seat belt for car occupants and not to seat children in front seats.
2. Encouraging and educating parents about the advantage of booster seat for children
3. Educating parents for the potential hazards for children below 6 years at home and try to teach them how to remove the hazards.
4. School survey with the help of schools’ staff
5. Ringing the safety bell at schools by the fire fighting department
6. More supervision for school buses by the traffic police
7. Training children and issuing them a identity card and reflecting cover as volunteer school police
8. Educating parents about the potential dangers on road to school from homes.
9. One day workshop for school principals in terms of the most dangerous areas at schools which is usually school playing yards.
10. Educating children about the use of bicycle helmet during cycling
11. Possessing campaign for the use of bicycle helmet, in that about 1000 cyclist involved.
12. Identifying the unsafe Park playing equipments and renew them.
13. Identifying the hotspots in district and remove the hazards

## 4. Safe Elderly

Since individual with age over 65 at the district level is 50% above the average population of the same age in Iran, special attention was put for the safety of this group of high risk. They include:

There are Two NGOs at the district actively dealing with the elder population:

1-The senior old age group

2- The women organization

3-The most activities focused on educating and health visit the elderly:

4-They help to educate them about risk factors, chronic illnesses specially the diabetes mellitus, and trauma prevention.

5-An expert team checked all the accident-prone spots of streets, crossroads, and squares etc. in the district22 and removed the hazardous places. A report of these activities presented to the committee along with before and after pictures.

4- Special attention made on leisure time safety with emphasis on to prevent fall among children and elderly of both sexes specially in winter time..

#### 5. Safe work

-district22 is the most growing area with high development of building construction.

-Program aiming safety among the workers who are working on building construction and people who are passing is developed.

- Mandatory insurance coverage for the constructors

- Regular inspection for safety devices used for buildings and buildings' workers.

#### 6. Violence prevention

-Social harms prevention and harm reduction program for young adult of both sexes

- Prevention of street violence at the public areas by educating youngsters with the help of NGO mostly "Hamshahraki "NGO.

- Developing a help number for reporting any domestic violence including violence against children.

- Promoting education among the schools' health staff for prevention of school based violence program.

#### 7. Suicide prevention

-Drug prevention and violence prevention against women program.

-Parental support program by use of volunteers.

-Developing a network of active NGOs to promote hopefulness and better lifestyle among each other.

-To some extent it is integrated with the leisure time safety activities (since the dist22 is the one of the pole for cycling). It is focused on promotion of helmet usage among the cyclists.

- To repair or change the play ground tools.

- To establish an emergency care unit including an ambulance with trained staff by the red crescent society inside the Chitgar area.

-Special emphasis made on promoting safe cycling among women with focus on young girls.

It is general activity performed by the ministry of Energy nationwide including Tehran district 22

#### 13 Safe schools

The program started on 6 July 2011. Two elementary schools, one for girls and one for boys entered in to the program. Focused was on injury prevention in school yard, in class room, at corridors and on the way to school and return home. Activities are included as:

1- A survey was performed in schools revealed the priorities

2- Seven workshops conducted for the school staffs

3- Safe community committee formed in school with involvement of schools' staff and



parents and representative of student.

- 4- Indicators for becoming safe school thought well.
- 5- Intention letter sent to the affiliated center for safe school in Czech republic
- 6- Checklist for identification of hazards in school areas was developed
- 7- Safety Education schemed for students and new comers was developed as a school policy

Survey and surveillance system

Every 2 years a household survey is performed to gathering data. First was done in 2006 and next in 2008, 2010, 2012 and 2014, this method is mainly used for evaluation and partly for prioritization

The other mechanism which has been set is through injury registry which is performed by the responsible organization and used for prioritization and somehow for evaluation

6.2 Has any contacts been established with ASCSCs , WHO CCCSP or other scientific institutions on the matter of evidence- based strategies? Which?

YES.

A joint work to develop a guide book for district 22 safe community was with WHO CCCSP. This book was used as the guide line for other districts of Tehran megacity to move forward to safe community.

## **Section 7. Describe work in regard to indicator 5**

7.1 Local data is a must for effective injury prevention.

Registering injuries can be done at hospitals, health centers, dentists, schools, care of the elderly organizations and the local police.

Household survey can also be used for collection of data about injuries and risk environments and risk situations.

Which methods are used in the community?

The community uses both the methods.

1- House hold survey

2- Injury registry

-Registration in health centers, EMS center, Police stations, fire fighting and rescue centers.

-At local hospital there is a continuous all injury recording based on ICD10 system developed by the injury prevention department at the ministry of health on 2005. All injuries treated in outpatient and in-patient is recorded.

-Home based surveillance started on 2007 and every other years will be evaluated by the same way.

The last survey was done on 2014

-The gaps between data registry by different care delivery centers including relevant NGOs revealed. To overcome this, all organizations agreed to revise their registration forms.

-Volunteers report based survey, started on 2007

-Field surveillance to determine the hot points by experts all over the district area

7.2 Describe how data are presented in order to promote safety and prevent injuries in the community. After analysis data presents at the safe community committee. Advocacy is taken from the members and priorities is set

8.1 Analyze results from the injury registration. What is working well and has given good results, what are the plans to continue? What needs to be changed?

The program is targeting leisure time safety (since the district 22 has become a point for the Tehran mega city entertaining site) so to view to this issue the following will be the priority for the next 5 years.

- 1- Traffic safety includes motorcyclists, cyclists, car driver, car occupants and pedestrians
- 2- School safety with special attention on youngsters and children in the form of safe school.
- 3- At home safety program the target groups are elderly and women.

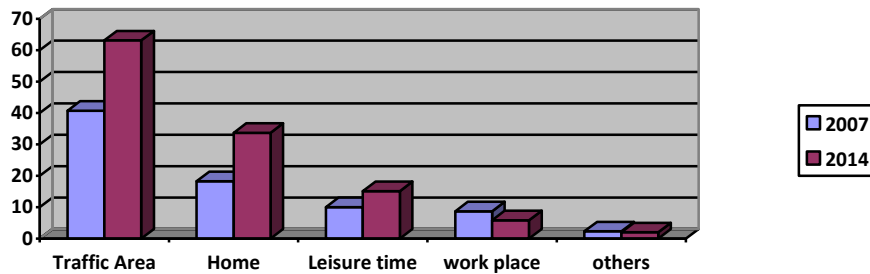
