<p>1.1 Briefly describe the community and its historical development</p> <p>Xizhi District located at New Taipei City, north Taiwan, has an area of 71.24 square kilometres. The area is full of mountains, rivers and temples. Xizhi was famous for tea and coal and now has gradually transformed from an old town into new technology town. The climate here is quite rainy and used to flood over when heavy rain comes as the drainage system was not great. After threat of flooding caused by several typhoons, the citizens started to pursue safer living.</p> <p>In 2005, the neighbourhood Neihu district was designated as International Safe Community, drawing the attention of the citizens in Xizhi. In 2009, Dr. Chih-Cheng Chien, who involved in Neihu Safe Community Program, was transferred to Xizhi Cathay General Hospital as the Superintendent. Dr. Chien brought in the idea of safe community and inspired Sioufong Community (including two boroughs) to take the lead join the program. In 2011, Xizhi Sioufong Community in New Taipei City was designated as the 255th International Safe Community. <p>The importance of safety is well known, but often ignored. We let the minority influence the majority gradually and expand the promoting area to the whole Xizhi District, for facilitating a safer and safer life.</p> <p>Before the first ISC designation, only two boroughs, Shioufong and Shioushan, worked on 5 safety issues, namely Home Safety, Traffic Safety, Recreational Safety, School Safety and Intentional Injury Prevention. In order to cope with the expansion, more boroughs are involved in the SC program. For the higher risk environment (slope and low-lying area) and the increasing of community poisoning accidents, the community added <u>Natural Disaster Prevention & Management and Medication & Food Safety Working Groups</u> in 2014.</p> <p>The national safety policies and measures are in a common consideration, hard to fit the specific needs of community. <p>1.4 Describe the injury risk-panorama in the community.</p> <p>In 2011, Xizhi Sioufong Safe Community Program contained two boroughs. Nowadays, the program has being expanded to the entire Xizhi District, 50 boroughs, covering a population of nearly 20 times, and comprehensively collects injury data. The injury analysis shows that traffic injury is still the main problem and followed by falls of children and the elderly at home. As to the environmental hazard, residential buildings of adjacent hillside face the problem of landslides. <p>2.1 Describe the demographic structure of the community</p> <p>Due to the blooming development of the high-tech industry in Xizhi District, the population has been growing continuously. By the end of 2015, there were 196,028 people, with a male to female ratio of 1:1.04. In terms of age distribution, 10.9% of the population was under 14 years old, 13.1% between 15~24 years old, 65.4% between 25~64 years old and 10.6% above 65 years old which also grew rapidly in the recent years. The population of the new immigrants also grows fast; the population reaches 3,796 already. For the demographics of Xizhi Community, please refer to the attachment, p.4, Table-1-2.</p> <p>For the injury risks with demographic features, most of the incidents involved males; children and adolescents and elders all require more attention. Cut, strike or caught in between, fall and traffic were the majority of injury incidents in the community. <p>2.2 Describe the SC/IP at present and the plans for the future.</p> <p>The current safety promotion issues of Xizhi Community include 7 items: home safety, traffic safety, leisure activities safety, school safety, intentional injury prevention, natural disaster prevention and management, medication and food safety. The safety works are incorporated with district office, fire department, health department and professional social organizations to conduct the promotions; Sijhih Cathy General Hospital is in charge of injury surveillance. Through the program operation, the aim is to improve the environments and escalate the safety awareness of local residents. Budget support and environment improvement: school and public place environment inspection and improvement, disaster alert system establishment and traffic construction in accident-prone intersections. Mayor of Xizhi District is the Chair of Xizhi Safe Community Committee, who is in charge of integrating community resources and decision making. District office staff is also part of the safety promotion program and support the action group and the Secretariat in carrying out improvement programs and information collection. The original chairman of Xizhi Shioufong SC is now the Director-general of the committee, who is in charge of the coordination and communication between the committee and the working groups. The 7 working groups include staff and local residents from more than 30 public and private sector units; the working groups, secretariat and injury surveillance group are responsible of designing and carrying out safety promotion works and data collection. <p>In Xizhi District, the injury analysis showed high percentage of cut/strike and fall accidents of children and the elderly at home; therefore, volunteer are trained every year to conduct home inspection and improvement for home safety. In 2014, the program was expanded to the whole Xizhi District; the working group puts more aggressive efforts by working with local borough/ neighborhood offices and schools to promote home safety, and holds household visits. Please refer to the attachment, p. 21~22.</p> <p>Recently, according to statistics provided by New Taipei City Domestic Violence Prevention Center, child abuse cases increased from 224 to 338 in 2014 (attachment, p.12-Table 15). As children under age and are extremely tied to family, since 2015, Keelung Family Support Center has been invited to have a joined program with our Intentional Injury Prevention Group to care and support such high-risk families. <p>There are frequent earthquakes in Taiwan, and it rains a lot in Xizhi; therefore, the residential houses and campus on the slope area in the district are high-risk environment.</p> <p>In 2010, the retaining wall of residential house in Fu Kee Resort, collapsed; with the suggestion of Home Safety Group and help of Sioushan Borough Office and Xizhi District Office, the residents received NTD40 millions governmental subsidy for the recovery construction. Later on, the working group works with Taiwan Architecture & Building Center to promote disaster prevention training and offers disaster prevention counseling and guidance to local residents. In response to general disaster prevention, Disaster Prevention & Management Team was established in 2014. In particular, the working group established earthquake alert sensors in campus located at slop area, such as Xizhi Elementary School and PaiYun Elementary School for teachers and students to gain response time before strong earthquakes.</p> <p>As to the Separate Automobile and Motorcycle Lanes project, the statistics shows that a year after the project, A1 class accident reduces by 1 and the death reduces by 1, while A2 accident reduces by 8 and the injured by 11 (the attachment, p.25~26).</p>

With regard to environment improvement, photos are taken for record before and after project implementation to assess the results.</p> <p>According to the emergency medical records provided by the Fire Department, drug/medication poisoning cases increased from 33 in 2012 to 75 in 2013; therefore Medication & Food Safety group was established in 2014 and Sijhih Cathay General Hospital supports greatly in safety awareness promotion.</p> <p>Xizhi Safe Community program is implemented more comprehensively.
