A.3 How do the head of the local government and the executive committee involve in the program? Is the foundation of mutual cooperation in every level of society established?

- In February 2012, we have organized the Safe Community Committee with the mayor as a chairman and 25 members from local community organizations. For an effective promotion of the program, we have also organized and managed the Safe Community Working-Level Committee with the citizen safety director as a chairman.
 - Organization and Management of the Safe Community Subcommittee
 - Organized the Safe Community Working-Level affiliated 6 subcommittees in February 2014 to secure professionals from each field (127 institutions and organizations participated)
 - Networked local government and related institutions with a private organization as a central figure to strengthen the local network by subcommittee

- Focus Program: Develop the 3 Citizen Campaigns for Advanced Traffic Culture
 - Attach and promote 3 slogan boards such as ‘Observe the Stop Line’ on buses and taxis
 - The stop line observation rate increased sharply by 7% (84% in 2013 → 91% in 2014)

A.4 Describe changes in the aspects of injury risk in community.

- In 2007, the national injury death rate was 58.6 people per 100,000 population (age standard injury death rate); in 2013, the national injury death rate was 50.9 people and it shows 7.7 people (13%) decrease in the injury death rate due to the consistent and effective Safety Promotion program by government and local government.
- The injury death rate in Gwangju was 57.5 people in 2007 and 62.0 people in 2009; the injury death rate in 2010 was decreased to 58.6 people. To compare with other cities with similar numbers of population and environment, Gwangju's injury death rate was higher than others with 49.3 people since Deagu's injury death rate was 46.8 people and Deajeon with 47.5 people in 2013.

- The population in Gwangju grew to 1,492,948 in 2014 by annual average of 0.7% with increased number of 84,842 people within the last 10 years.
- The male population was 731,339 (excluding foreigner population) and female population was 744,545 in Gwangju Metropolitan City in 2014. The population is mostly consisted of the age group of people in their 40s of 260,090.

○ The children population (age 0-14, excluding foreigner population) shows a consistently decreasing trend (21.8% in 2005 → 16.1% in 2014); however, the population of seniors over 65 years old is annually increasing (7.1% in 2005 → 10.8% in 2014) which shows an increasing numbers of a vulnerable social group.

- 6.3** Describe changes in injury patterns, attitude toward injury, behaviors, risk factor cognition as results of the Safe Community program.
- * Changes in safety policies of Gwangju Metropolitan**
- By promoting the International Safe Community Designation program, we built a legal and institutional foundation for promoting safety and preventing injuries of citizens. We also established the Safe Community network by developing various resources for the Safety Promotion program.
 - We analyze injury data of Gwangju citizens and publish annual injury statistics books. We reflect the result of injury data analysis to establish more scientific safety policies.
 - Instead of the result-oriented program, we focus more on developing the International Safe Community program by evaluating the result to improve it and expand the Safety program to local organizations.
- * Changes in injury rates**
- The injury death rate caused by a car accident decreased to 10.06% in 2013 compared to that of 12.67% in 2009. The injury death rate caused by a car accident in male population significantly decreased from 18.91% to 13.39%.
 - The injury death rate caused by assault decreased from 1.82 people per 100,000 population in 2009 to 0.82 people per 100,000 population in 2013.
 - The injury rate caused by fall shows a decreasing trend from 5.53 people per 100,000 population in 2009 to 4.93 people per 100,000 population in 2013. The biggest change is shown in the age group of 65 and older.
 - The injury rate caused by fall shows a decreasing trend from 5.53 people per 100,000 population in 2009 to 4.93 people per 100,000 population in 2013. The biggest change is shown in the age group of 65 and older.
- * Changes in attitude and behaviors toward injury**
- The traffic safety culture index of Gwangju is higher in every field than the national traffic safety culture index. The traffic safety culture index of Gwangju in 2014 is 80.02, which is higher by 3.32 compared to the national average of 76.70.
 - The traffic safety index of Gwangju has been the highest in Korea for the last 5 years since 2009.
