B.11 Are economic incentives in order to increase safety used? If yes, how are they used? In the gathering, the gifts are distributed and educational brochures in a package. In the workshops which are held different devices and helmets are distributed. In gathering and workshops some matches are held about safety and some gifts will be awarded to the winners by the municipality. Also some parties and ceremonies are held for different ages such as Children's Day Fireworks Wednesday.

B.12 Are there local regulations for improved safety? If so, describe them
There many activities in this field, such as having contractors, employers to use security covers, legislated laws motorcyclist by the cooperation of traffic police, safety evaluation of buildings by the cooperation of Civil-Technical Department of Municipality and reported to District's Mayor. Also installing extinguishers and first aid kinds in all the buildings by cooperation of Firefighting Department.

1.1 Describe the cross-sector group responsible for managing, coordinating, and planning of the SP/IP program.

Some of organizations are the masters of workgroups such as firefighting, emergency and etc. The experts of Safe Community with participation of **Mending Organization's** facilitators for convincing the building owners in old region of city by the direct interview (go to every house and talk to the owners).

1.2 Describe how the local government and the health sector are collaborating in the SC/IP work.

The educations of Safety and immunization are done by The Health Office. There are four Health Head Offices that contributed (gathering) especially about injury prevention workgroups. The staff of the municipality tested and checked up by the area clinics. We appropriated the side walk, streets and the **entrance** of different parts, for disable people such as blinds and **physical disables, Physical disabilities - mobilit**. We sent safely massage and held workshops about sitting correctly on chairs for clerks.

1.3 How are NGOs: RedCross, retirement organizations, sports organizations, parent and school organizations involved in the SC/IP work?

The each other organizations involved in activities such as head of district's firefighting as boss Residential places and houses workgroups. Commander of traffic police is boss of prevention traffic injury and accident workgroup. Chairman of Parents and Coach Association is the head of School Safety workgroup. The member of district council identified traumatic places and provides data to workgroups. Imams Jamaat participated in different workgroups and tried to immunization mosques.

1.4 Are there any systems for ordinary citizens to inform about risk environments and risk situations they have found in the community? The secretary of safe community's district 17 informs in different ways. For example distributed brochures in seminars, festivals and every program that held by the other organizations and up to now more than 100,000 brochures have been distributed based on prevention of deaths caused by CO gas, electric shock, elderlies and children safety and other prevention injuries such as falling. 10 tips are put across the area by the slogan of safety, and are changed every week. Every week a safety slogan is sent to the cooperation. They taught at schools and the brochures are distributed and also many gathering are held and taught.

1.5 Describe how the work is organized in a sustainable manner. The secretary of safe community has long term and short term about decreasing injuries and accidents and increasing safety in different parts. Short term programs are those that are laid down in workgroups and are followed up by working performance such as repairing lights of foot bridges, street lineation and fixing the potholes in street and immunization toys in parks.

13. Safe schools: Holding traffic safe actions training courses of schools with the cooperation of traffic police. Evaluating of old schools and reported to reconstructions and mending office.

Describe all activities like falls prevention and how the work is done: Many various training programs are provided for children and elderly. For elderly training about diabetes and for children: tips for passing streets and traffic signs. Even for different **guilds** such as bus drivers, taxies, motorcyclists and constructional workers some training courses are contemplated.

1. Describe how risk environments in the community are identified: : The neighborhoods are prioritized in aspect of being injuries. For example in spite of many smuggler and addicts in Zehtabi and Eastern Abuzar and again despite many industrial places and domesticated preserving centers, are dangerous areas. It has been tried to collect domesticated preserving centers. The brochures about respecting safety points and covering points are distributed in industrial places. For cleaning the neighborhood from criminals, cooperation with police is done.
